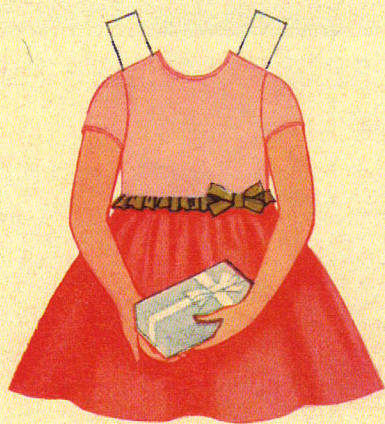


# Betsy McCall goes to a wedding

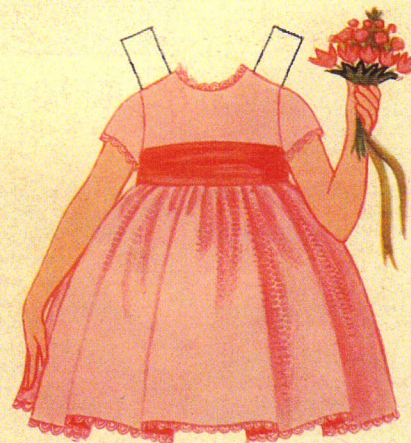
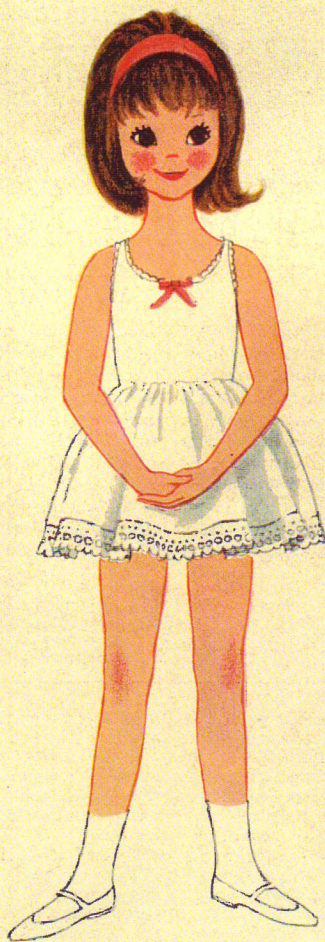
