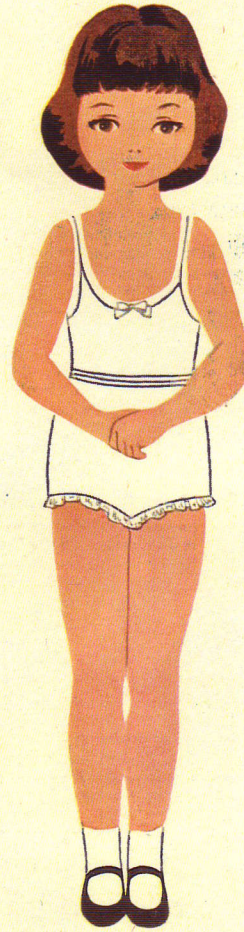
"You set the table," Betsy said to Barbara, "and I'll get the food." Barbara very carefully spread the little cloth on the small table and set out Betsy's precious new dishes



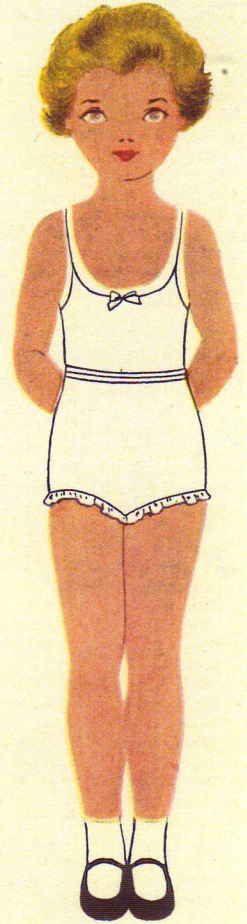

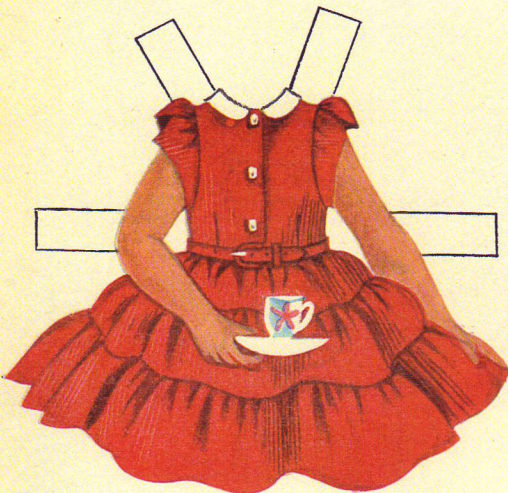

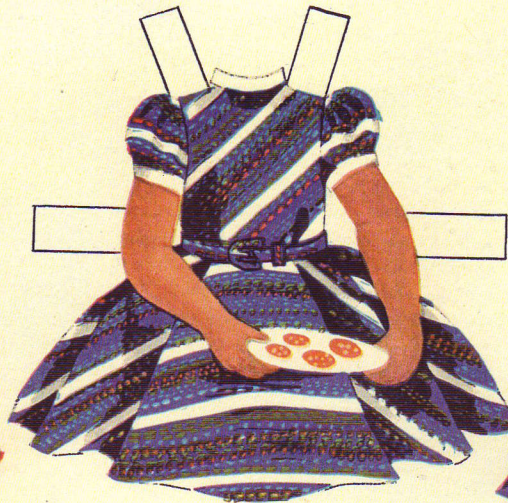
