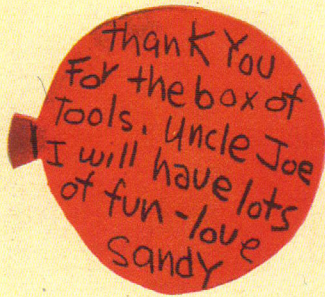
Linda "wrote" her thank-you letters. Then Betsy translated them and helped her sign her name



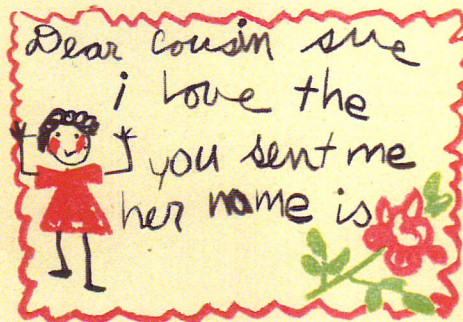
Inside this one Betsy wrote "... for the pretty red sweater, Aunt Helen"



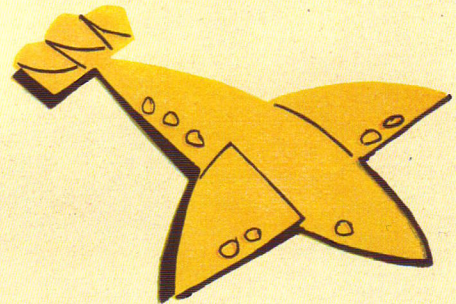
Betsy made a cutout of the wagon Uncle Joe gave her and then drew a picture of herself pulling it



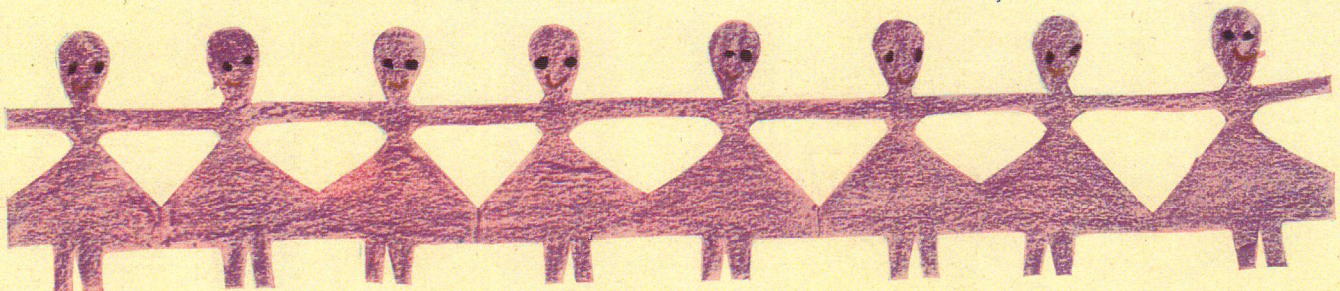
Sandy blew up a balloon and wrote on it. Then he let the air out and mailed it
