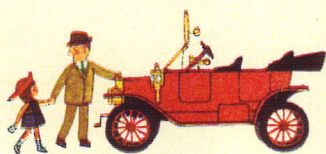
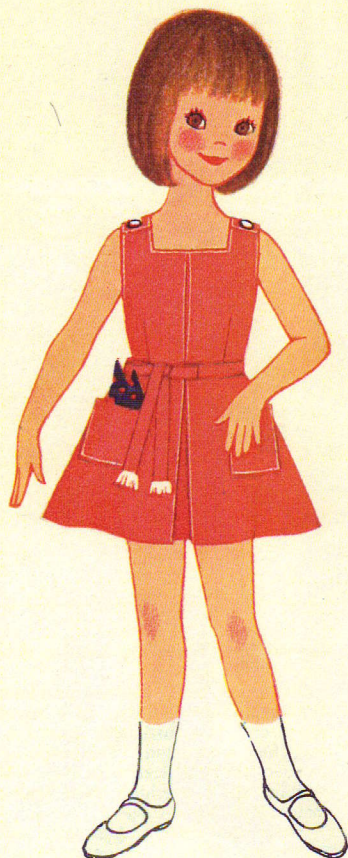


## BETSY MCCALL Visits Greenfield Village

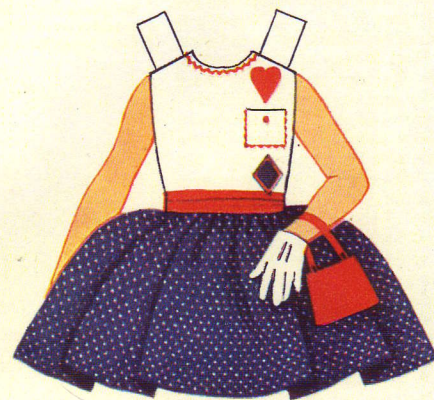


Have you visited Greenfield Village? During my spring vacation, Daddy took Mommy and me there.
